Welcome to Week 9. Two very busy weeks before the end of term. This week K-2 students are heading to the K-2 Enrichment Day. The venue for this event was to be Lowanna Public School, however changes to venue have had to be made. Students will now be travelling to Ulong Public School. A new note did go home last week. A canteen is now available for purchases over the day. Students are still to bring their own lunch.

Each year we ask for our school voluntary contribution of \$50 per child, up to 3 children, to be paid at the beginning of the year. The price is reduced for additional children in a family. In addition, we asked parents to purchase their child's Well-being journal, costing \$10, which will cover your child for a two year period and for K-2 parents to purchase a home reading diary, costing \$4 per year. To date we have approximately 25% of the school having covered the costs of the above items. Updated invoices were sent out to families on Friday and we would appreciate if essential items be paid before the end of term 3 and voluntary contributions paid if possible. These contributions assist us in purchasing new readers for the library and resources for student learning.

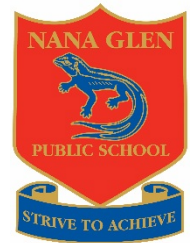
