### From the Principal's desk

Giinagay; welcome to week 3. I encourage all parents to please look at the calendar above and save the date for upcoming major events. As this received negative feedback from parents, we are not going to invite any year 5 parent specifically for the leader's announcement. However, all parents are welcome to the assembly. Please support your child in this situation as they hold this role in high esteem, and it can be upsetting when they are not successful. We have so many worthy upcoming leaders that this will once again be difficult.

Over the next two weeks I will be out of the school. Next week I will be in Sydney and the following week Mrs Daniel and myself will be at a conference in Queensland. Next week please refer any concerns to either Mrs Daniel or Mr Hugo and in week 5, please refer any concerns to Mr Hugo.

As the end of year approaches, we see students get tired and their patience become short. We are presently dealing with a few incidents involving gossip. We seek support of parents in encouraging students to not get involved in this sort of behaviour as it always ends badly with hurt feeling and loss of trust in friendship relationships. We have discussed this with students and have dealt with any situation that has arisen and have encouraged all students to move forward.

**Teacher Appreciation Day** – We are recognising the great work of our teaching staff this Thursday. The theme for this year is "Hats off to Teachers". The kids are encouraged to join in on Thursday and please ask them what they need. As we are keeping it a secret from staff, you will need to ask your child. Call the office if worried.

K-2 are heading to Ulong Public School this Friday. If you have not returned your child's note, please do so as soon as possible. This is the expectation that all students will attend as this is an annual key learning day where our students not only learn new skills, but also have a chance to connect with students at other schools in the valley. All K-2 staff will be attending this event.

It is pleasing to see that attendance is moving back on schedule now that the flu season seems to be moving on. I remind parents that if you are intending to take your child(ren) out of school for a family holiday, you must complete documentation to do so. We understand why parents do this; however, it is a requirement that all students are present at school when ever the school is operational. Occasions such as floods and disasters are exceptions. In addition, please be aware that removal from school for extended periods, is always considered an unjustified period of leave unless for medical reasons.

**Arrival early at school** - We are once again seeing numbers increase, of students arriving very early to school. There has always been the requirement that parents contact me and discuss this need. In addition, it is a parent's responsibility to walk your child into the school to ensure there is a teacher on site who is aware that your child has arrived. *Arrival before 8:30am should not occur without consultation.* Staff often do arrive early however they are not on duty until 8:50am. Our staff have started this duty 10 minutes earlier than required, to support our families and students. Staff use their time for preparation and organisation of lessons or school meetings.

Intensive Swimming is coming up very quickly. A note will be coming home this afternoon. The school is going to support parents with the cost. The total costing is \$35. **Parents are required to pay \$15 in total**, per student, with the school paying the remainder of costs for each student. This is only for the entry to the pool, and we ask that **all payments be made by Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November**. These payments can be made to the office or online as a POP.

Friday swimming is well underway, and we encourage parents to ensure ALL students have their gear for Fridays. Kinders can arrive with their swimmers under their school uniform, however a dry pair of underwear is essential to change into after swimming. We are seeing many items left here on Fridays. Staff hang them up to dry and can be collected on the Monday. The school is utilising our sporting grant, and school funding to support parents and have all our students gain swimming instruction in term 4.

**Year 6 Events** – There are our annual Year 6 events coming up. Please look at dates in the calendar above. Students will soon receive notes for the Principals Big Day Out and the Dinner. Please remind your child that these events are reliant on continued outstanding behaviour. Cost to the dinner will be \$10 per student. Our P&C have always supported the costing of this event.

**School Raffle** – Our major raffle is presently in process. Students have been busy selling tickets and we have our student bikes again this year for ticket sellers. If any families or organisations would like to support the school with prize donations, they are not required, But always very welcome.

We look forward to an exciting term, with many end of year events, as well as lots of learning happening. I want to really thank our staff for their outstanding work and dedication to every student in our school.

### Getting Along with Behaviourally Challenging Students

#### 3 Tips for Teachers

Establishing and maintaining healthy relationships with students whose behaviour challenges both teachers and other students is a core strategy for the classroom management toolbox.

Here are three top tips for getting along with students whose behaviour is difficult to manage.

#### Create kindness and empathy

Begin each day with the assumption that this student is doing the best they can in any situation. Consider their red zone behaviours as unskilful attempts to have their needs met. Questions that may be helpful to ask yourself include; how come they learnt to behave this way? And, what context might have shaped the way this student sees the world?

Keep in mind that like you this student has hopes and dreams. Like you they have fears and worries. Like you they have people they care about and people who care for them. Like you they wish they could be the best version of themselves.

#### Tune in and be attentive

Get curious about who this person is and who they might like to become. Find out their likes and dislikes by asking the student questions, and then ask again. Look interested and adopt a friendly posture. If they respond with 'dunno' or nothing at all, it's possible they really don't know. Take this uncertainty as an opportunity to connect and find out the answer together. Keep it fun by using a friendly or playful tone of voice.

#### Model how to manage feelings

If you notice the student's behaviour is escalating towards the red zone, model how you would like the student to regulate their emotions. Stop, take a breathe, and observe what's happening inside and outside. Then proceed with greater flexibility in how you choose to respond.

Relationships can be repaired - if you are willing. The power of coming back to a distrustful student and taking ownership for your own behaviour by saying, 'sorry I made the wrong call there, let's try again,' will have an impact on the student (even if they don't show it straight away). Next time they make an unskillful action, listen to see if they make the same offer and be ready to receive it.

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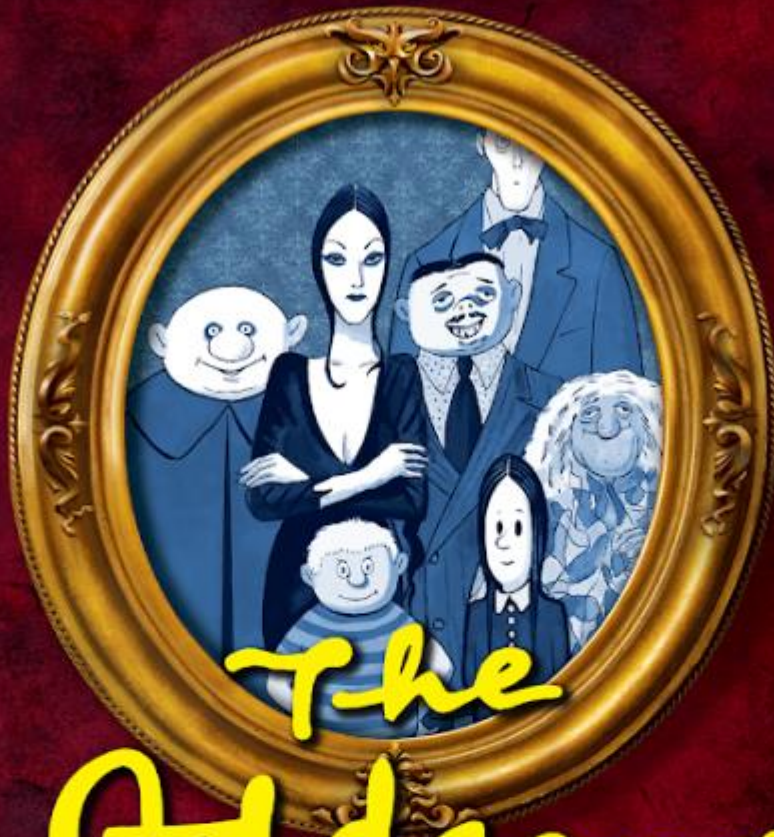
