From the Principal's desk

Giinagay; welcome to week 2. We had a very busy week one. Staff all completed training on Tuesday to support the new behaviour policies coming in the next 6 months. As the OVLC Cross Country was cancelled last week, students ran yesterday to gain a time for possible inclusion in this Friday's District Cross Country event. Notes will go out as soon as received and will need to be returned the following day. We wish all students well at the district event and Mr Chapman will be accompanying students to this event. It was great to see so many parents at Friday's school athletics' carnival. Unfortunately, the weather was not kind, once again. Students and teachers spent yesterday catching up events for 8 years and older to ensure that students who qualified for next Monday's OVLC Athletics Carnival would have their nominations submitted. Industrial Action

All families were emailed yesterday regarding the Industrial Action planned for this Wednesday. Updating this information; there will be 4 teaching staff here at Nana Glen Public School for appropriate lessons to be conducted over the day. Your child will have a teacher from our school, but this may not be their regular teacher and classes will be combined where required. Support staff and office staff are also present to cater for needs of individual students requiring this.

Attendance

Once again attendance is being highlighted at school with this being one of our Premier's Targeted Priorities. We are still seeing many students missing part days of school. Appointments need to be made outside school hours where possible and regular appointments should be definitely outside school hours. Our attendance letter that was sent home to every child at the end of last term will be sent home to every child at the end of this term as well. In addition, children with attendance under 90% will receive the note early in week 6 to illustrate the first 5 weeks attendance,

including partial attendance data. Please be aware that high partial attendance levels are just as detrimental to students successfully engaging with their learning and their peers, as whole day absenteeism. To increase student growth and achievement, students need to be at school for the whole day. We are seeing patterns of students missing part of a particular day each week and the impact of this can be that your child will miss a whole area of learning. For example, if your child misses Thursday afternoon, every week, they could miss science every week.

A Big Thankyou

Last term, our staff and community fundraised to support Main Arm Public School who were devastated by the flooding in the North Coast area. Staff and students have sent through a huge thank you to everyone and were overwhelmed with everyone's generosity. This was a beautiful opportunity for our school and community to give back and was highly appreciated. Well done everyone.



APRIL ARTICLE

15 Tips for Teachers of Dyslexic Students

- 1. Utilise audio books to listen to and/or read along with.
- Verbal instructions should be repeated by the teacher and the student, written instructions should be simplified.
- 3. Allow extra time for assessments.
- Provide options with assessments, eg. oral presentations, video, circle answers rather than write them, etc.
- Mark the content of the work, not the spelling.
- 6. Count to 5 when asking questions to allow processing time before responses.
- 7. Provide a list of terms/definitions for the current topic.
- 8. Have a buddy system in place, especially helpful for sharing of notes.
- Use visuals to support, eg. highlight, include an image, no unnecessary information/images on worksheets.
- Provide hands on learning opportunities.
- 11. Check in regularly with the student to offer praise, support, etc.
- 12. Reduce repetitive work, eg answer every 2nd question.
- 13. Provide a print out of notes to highlight rather than expect them to copy.
- 14. Recognise homework will take longer and adjust accordingly.
- Provide readers at their age/interest level, whilst also suitable for their current reading level. Suggested contact: https://sherlock.library.det.nsw.edu.au/




